

## Sermon Worksheet, 7/12/09

Passage: Acts 10:1-11:18

Theme: I am God's Temple No.7

*Don't you know that  
you yourselves are  
God's temple and that  
God's Spirit lives in  
you? (1 Cor 3:16)*



In this drill, we will look at an example of how the Holy Spirit can help us.

### Observations:

- 1) Let us look at chapter 11 first. What kinds of people were present there, and what were they discussing? From 11:18, what do you find about the way the Jews of the time thought of “**repentance unto life**”?
- 2) Coming back to chapter 10, can you explain why Peter denied to eat the animals and birds contained in the large sheet? Also, when the voice said, “**Do not call anything impure that God has made clean,**” what did it mean? Seeing what happened after this, what was it “**that God has made clean**”?
- 3) Underline the words “**the Spirit**” and “**the Holy Spirit**” in this passage. Keeping in mind what Jesus said the Holy Spirit would do for the disciples in John’s gospel, explain how the Holy Spirit helped Peter through this experience.

### Personal Applications:

- 1) Have you ever experienced that the ideas you thought were right turned out to be wrong and against the truth of the Bible? Can you share with others how you came to know they were wrong, and explain how different you are now from the time you had those ideas?
- 2) If the ideas you had in the past were wrong, do you admit that there is a great possibility that the ideas you have now may be wrong too? If that is so, do you desire to be changed (better)? If so, what attitude do you need to have?
- 3) What is the reason when people say, “The sermon is hard and difficult to understand”? Also, is it possible that even if you think you understand, but you really do not understand yet? Regarding this, how do you believe the Holy Spirit will help you?

### Prayers, and etc.

- 1) Thank God and the Holy Spirit that you have come to understand the truth up to this point. And ask the Holy Spirit to help you to know what you do not know yet, or what you think you know but really don’t know.
- 2) Pray for your group, and your family that they will continue to learn the same truth together and come to have more the unity of the Holy Spirit.
- 3) Continue to pray for “**everyone**” and “**all the saints**” that they come to know more about Jesus by the Holy Spirit. Pray also for the recent and the future newcomers, and for the coming Summer Bible Camp.
